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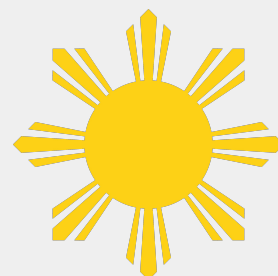

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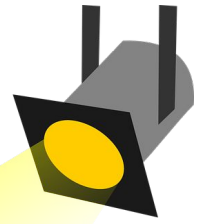

SUBJECT SPOTLIGHT:



Mathematics:

To finish out the school year, sixth grade students will be focusing on wrapping up the 6th grade material not yet mastered and begin exploring 7th grade concepts. Advanced Math students will focus on the 7th grade Algebraic Concepts not yet taught. The students will continue to use i-Ready as a learning tool and will take the 7th grade or Algebra Placement test to determine their class for the next year.



Social Studies:

In Social Studies classes, sixth graders have learned about North America. We have studied North America's Geography and United States and Canadian History. Our learning in Chapter 3 will conclude with The History of Mexico. We will then transition to North America Today with lessons about cultures, cultural diversity, economy, and citizen's rights and responsibilities.



Science:

To finish the school year, we will be looking at the Earth's rotation and revolution around the sun and the Moon's orbit around the Earth. We will focus on how these movements cause seasons, day and night, moon phases and eclipses. We will wrap up the year with a quick review of magnetism and electricity before moving on to 7th grade!



ELA:

As we come to an end this school year in ELA, we will be finishing up by completing our Informative writing unit. We will continue to work through Unit 4. We are finished our ELA PSSA's. We are very proud of the students' hard work! Other skills this month include rereading, using context clues, and reviewing Idioms.
