Kennard-Dale & Hanover High Students Visit JA's Challenge at Finance Park[™]



Recently, high school students from Kennard-Dale and Hanover High Schools made their way into The Challenge at Finance Park™ to learn how to be financially successful in the real world. The students sat in groups and experienced the challenges presented by day-care, college loans, credit card debt, poor credit scores, two income family issues, plus the challenges of living on a limited income.

The power of The Challenge at Finance Park[™] is discovery learning that takes place as the students dealt with some truly challenging life scenarios. The simulation is intended to model an x-game focused on financial literacy. This life-like simulation immersed the students in fast paced hands on learning where they faced difficult real world decisions. In 4 hours, The Challenge at Finance Park[™] provided a number of reflection points for the Kennard-Dale and Hanover High School students. Each of these teachable moments allowed our financial volunteers to offer advice and options. The following are some of the key concepts covered during the program: savings and investing, college loans, credit, choices and consequences and building a budget.

New for this school year, the Kennard-Dale and Hanover High School students were one the first to participate in the totally revamped The Challenge at Finance ParkTM. Help for Haiti



Several months ago two students at Washington Elementary School, Abbi Martin (4th grader) and Regin Smith (3rd grader), approached Mrs. Carol Forbes because they wanted to raise items to send to her school in Haiti, Institution Univers, before the end of the school year. After getting the "OK" from principal Dr. Tom Krout, they visited the school's website and chose three supplies that are ongoing needs for Univers: #2 pencils, colored pencils and bar erasers. A competition between classrooms was started as cardboard boxes were put in each classroom for the items that the students brought to school. The classroom that brings in the most items will win a free recess in the final days of school. Also, they wanted to write letters to some of the students at IU. Letters had to be written in French because that is the language spoken in the school.

They realized that students could come up with some French sentences by using Google Translate and decided to offer this to classes in second, third and fourth grades. Basic sentences were translated by Google's Translate site and then carefully scrutinized by a French teacher at Lamberton Middle School in Carlisle where Mr. Forbes teaches. Some French phrases were also checked by Amy Crist, French teacher at HMS. Letters were completed on June 4th and 5th and students were invited to bring in a small photo to attach to their letter. High School Students Compete at 8th Annual JA Titan Challenge

High school students from many York County Schools arrived at the Penn State York Campus to take part in a day of learning, team work and business decision making. The JA Titan Challenge required these high school students to make critical economic and management decisions to students through an interactive computer simulation. The students participated in two rounds of the business strategy competition. Each team was comprised of two high school students to form companies. As a team, they made business decisions in the marketplace by adjusting the price, production, marketing, capital investment, research & development and charitable giving. The teams competed through several rounds of the simulation and were challenged to outperform the competition in profit, sales, and market share.

Along with the online simulation, the students participated in two team build-



ing activities as part of the Entrepreneurial Challenge. The Aluminum Foil Sculpture activity promoted innovative thinking and the Marshmallow Challenge encouraged prototyping and teamwork. Other special events at the Titan Challenge included guest speaker Michael Falco from The Executive Peer Forum who spoke on the traits of an entrepreneur and a Penn State York representative who spoke on the benefits of a business degree.

At the end of the event, the winners of the 8th annual Titan Challenge were announced. The final score was based on a Performance Index, a weighted measurement of aspects of companies' value and performance, calculated from the two rounds of interactive computer simulation competition. Team Egg Roll from East Pennsboro High School in Harrisburg took home the \$1,000 scholarship for each student on the team to go towards continuing education. The first runner-up at Penn State York, with each student receiving a \$500 scholarship, was team Market Madness from Northeastern High School.


