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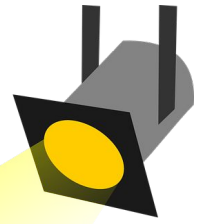

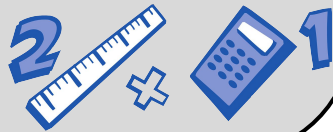
SUBJECT SPOTLIGHT:



Mathematics:

Sixth grade math students just completed the second iReady diagnostic test, and we are looking at the results to find areas of strengths and weaknesses. Course 1 is working through Module 5- Numerical and Algebraic Expressions and Advanced Math Students are working on Course 2 -Writing and Solving Equations.

As a reminder, students are expected to be completing iReady lessons each week, spending at least 10 minutes per day on their online Individualized Instruction to enhance their math skills .



Social Studies:

In Social Studies classes, we continue to learn about Unit 1: The Essentials of Geography: The Earth, Physical and Human Geography. We will then begin to learn about North America with a focus on the Geography and History of North America, and North America today.



Science:

We just started our newest section in physics and energy. Students are starting to learn how forces and energy transformations shape the physical world. We just learned that electricity is an energy and electrical energy is caused by electrons moving about to make a current. As the month progresses, students will learn how thermal energy moves using insulators and conductors.



ELA:

This month in ELA, we will continue to work on Unit 3. This unit offers a mixture of texts, both fiction and informational, about people that face uncertainty, including the classic myth "Heroes Every Child Should Know: Perseus," Rick Riordan's *The Lightning Thief*, Pat Mora's "Elena," "I, Too" by Langston Hughes, and Carl Hiaasen's *Hoot*. As we read, we will continue to work on various reading strategies as well as grammar and writing. As always, students should be reading at least 20 minutes every night.
