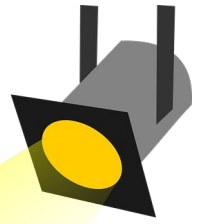

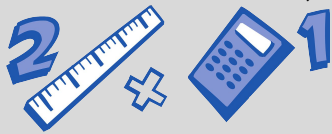

SUBJECT SPOTLIGHT:



Mathematics:

To finish out the school year, sixth grade students will be focusing on wrapping up the 6th grade material not yet mastered and begin exploring 7th grade concepts. Advanced Math students will focus on the 7th grade Algebraic Concepts not yet taught. The students will continue to use i-Ready as a learning tool and will take the 7th grade or Algebra Placement test to determine their class for the next year.



Social Studies:

In Social Studies classes, students will be completing our trip around the world learning about the geography of Southeast Asia. Following that, we will be making our final stop in Australia, Oceania, and Antarctica! .

Science:

To finish the school year, we will be investigating how Earth's climate is changing. We will be looking into how climate works, what data scientists have been using to detect how climate has been changing, and the ways humans have contributed to climate change in recent history.



ELA:
