7th Grade Subject Spotlight



Science:

During the fourth marking period in science class the topic of study is astronomy. Students will study the planets, asteroids, comets, meteors, galaxies, stars, and interactions between the sun, Earth, and moon.



English Language Arts:

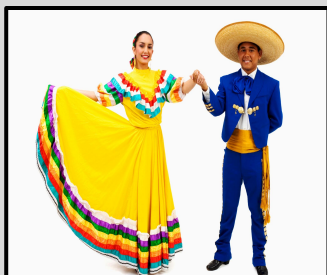
Social Studies:
