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

SUBJECT SPOTLIGHT:



Mathematics:

As we have ended the first marking period, students in sixth grade math have completed working through Fraction Operations and Ratios and are now mastering Decimal Operations and Percent. Advanced Math students are also mastering Equations involving Percent Problems- writing and solving equations and proportions. Ask your student to solve some real world problems when you are out and about - adding and subtracting decimals and finding percentages of numbers % \$ \$!



Social Studies:

The sixth graders just finished their learning about the Community and Economy with our field trip to JA Biztown in York, PA. The students had a blast running the town for the day and learned many valuable life lessons along the way. We will now begin learning about United States history with our unit on Creating a Government. Students will learn about the earliest days in our nation's history with the Articles of Confederation and what led our founding fathers to create the United States of America.

Science:

Now that we have travelled through the water cycle, we are learning how meteorologists are able to predict the weather using various instruments including rain gauges, anemometers, wind vanes, and thermometers and barometers. We will be wrapping up our meteorology unit with a culminating personalized activity and unit assessment.

ELA:

This month in Language Arts our class will be focusing on answering the question, "What can we gain from reading about past civilizations?". We will incorporate the use of Venn Diagrams to help as a comprehension tool to compare and contrast. We will discuss Author's Point of View and continue to decipher what the writer's attitude or perspective is on a certain subject as we read different articles. As usual, we will continue to have our weekly vocabulary and spelling tests.
