# **Mathematics:**

We have started our investigations in geometry, classifying shapes in a hierarchy, and analyzing patterns and relationships. We continue with data, patterns, and types of graphs. Tales, Biographies, Poetry, and


continues to play an important role as we begin to think about the upcoming PSSA's.
