

Mathematics:

Sixth grade has been working hard on Unit 3 EDM Decimal Operations and Percent using the US Traditional algorithms to calculate multiplying and dividing decimals. The Students in Course 2 Glencoe, have completed Integers in Chapter 3 and are beginning Chapter 4 Rational Numbers. Please encourage your child to keep up with his/her Study Island assignments, as well as to practice his/her math facts (there are many online programs, to help struggling students).

Social Studies:

In 6th grade Social Studies, we continue to learn about current events in our country and around the world. We have also been busy studying the beginnings of the United States of America, where we have learned about The Articles of Confederation and The Weaknesses of The Articles of Confederation. We will continue learning about the Constitution, Branches of Government, and Checks and Balances throughout the holiday season. Happy Holidays!

Science:

For the month of December, we will be continuing our Introduction to Geology unit.
